Workplace Injuries Continue to Take a Toll on U.S. Industries

BRIGHT SIDE: 2014 rates show injury rates decreasing in the past 12 years - *except in 2012.*

Events involving **overexertion** and bodily reaction are the leading cause of nonfatal injuries and illnesses **with days away from work** in 2014.

7 SECONDS

In 2013, an on-the-job injury occurred every 7 seconds in the U.S.

54,000 FEWER

nonfatal injury/illness cases in 2014 compared to 2013.

235 MILLION DAYS

production time lost due to off-the-job injuries in 2011.

NEARLY 5 MILLION

medically consulted injuries occurred across all industries in 2012.

45

MILLION DAYS of time lost in future years from work-related injuries recorded in 2012.

225,550

nonfatal slips, trips or falls in private sector industries in 2011.
